

Nominations for Chancellor's Task Force

We are seeking nominations for the USAP Task Force and invite you to nominate outstanding colleagues for possible appointment by the Chancellor. You may also nominate yourself. The task force is made up of twenty-four persons and we currently have 7 Academic and 4 Academic-Support positions to fill.

Nominations are due April 20th and will be vetted by Deans, Vice Chancellors and Faculty Senate and selected by the Chancellor. Those chosen will be notified and announced to the Campus Community by May 1st.

Responsibilities and Criteria

The Task Force is responsible for implementing the second year of the University Strategic Alignment Process (USAP), including modifying the unit report format and process. This group will be responsible for the *analysis* of the data that is reported and will produce recommendations on how to better align university resources based on data and strategic level planning.

Due to the extremely critical nature of their tasks, this group needs to be selected with intentionality. Individuals will not be chosen based on their title or position.

We are looking for individuals with strong reputations and credibility within the institution. Nominees should be able to think outside-the-box, embrace change, and bring new ideas to the table.

Additional characteristics for the makeup of the Task Force are desired, including the following:

- Understands and embraces the mission of IPFW, is student-centered, and would be an effective team member
- Is representative of the diversity of faculty and staff, including appropriate balances with respect to gender, ethnicity, college or department representation, long- and short-term seniority, and program size
- Displays personal characteristics such as critical thinking, analytic skills, problem-solving, fair-mindedness, empathy, and openness to differing viewpoints
- Has earned a high level of credibility as demonstrated by respect of peers and has potential for leadership
- Is able to serve as an Institutional Trustee rather than a Departmental or College Delegate

Timeframe and Commitment

Each person selected to serve on a Task Force will be expected to participate in training during the summer months for approximately 25 hours. Task Force Members will be expected to make this work their highest priority, second only to teaching and lab work or other primary job responsibilities. Task Force Members will be granted moratorium on committee work as appropriate.

The term is expected to last approximately 12-24 months.

Nomination forms must be completed for every person who wishes to be considered.
