Application Process

This application must be submitted by all students who desire to take courses leading to a graduate degree in counselor education. Applicants who do not meet the standards required in this application may present written evidence to justify differences, and this information will be considered in determining admission. The Counselor Education Program is competitive and not all applicants will be admitted. Application materials are reviewed both by the Counselor Education faculty and the Dean of the School of Education (for consideration of acceptance to graduate study). Preference is given to applications completed before May 1. If granted, a group interview will take place the third Saturday in May. Applicants are notified of acceptance shortly thereafter. Entry into the program begins with the fall semester. Licenses may be pursued upon completion of the degree.
