

2002-03 IPFW SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION

Financial Aid Services at IPFW administers a wide variety of scholarships for undergraduate IPFW students. Many scholarships are based on both financial need and academic achievement. Only a few scholarships are based entirely on academic achievement. Application procedures and deadlines vary, so students should contact the source listed in this booklet for current information. Dollar amounts awarded for these scholarships also vary. The average award is approximately \$500. This booklet lists university scholarships administered by IPFW Financial Aid Services, and the contact for further information. Not every scholarship listed will be awarded for 2002-03. All awards are dependent on availability of funds each year.

In addition to the scholarships listed, several other financial aid programs are available for students. IPFW Financial Aid Services administers all of the federal and state financial assistance programs. Completion of a new or renewal Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is required. These applications must be submitted between January 1 and March 1 of each year to qualify for priority consideration for funds. **Students may obtain the 2002-03 FAFSA at Financial Aid Services after January 1, 2002.** The office is located at Kettler Hall 102B, 2101 E. Coliseum Blvd., Fort Wayne, IN 46805-1499.

Scholarships open to new students are listed in the General and Freshman Scholarship sections. Some departmental scholarships are also open to new students. Students should review the school and departmental information for their intended majors.

To apply for these scholarships, students should meet the stated criteria. **Scholarships which specify Ademonstrated financial need@ require completion of a new or renewal 2002-03 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).**

Many scholarships also require a 2002-03 Special Programs Application. **This form will also be available at Financial Aid Services after January 1, 2002.**

FRESHMAN SCHOLARSHIPS

Chancellor=s Scholarship

Criteria: Half-tuition scholarships awarded annually to 50 incoming new high school graduates who are admitted by Mar. 1, who will earn an Indiana Core 40 or Academic Honors Diploma (residents of other states will have followed a college preparatory high school curriculum), and who either:(a) rank in the top 10 percent of their high school class and have SAT scores of 1200 or greater or an ACT composite of 27 or greater; or (b) rank in the top 5 percent of their high school class and have SAT scores of 1100 or greater or an ACT composite of 24 or greater; or (c) have earned semifinalist or finalist status in the National Merit scholarship competition. No scholarship application is required. Awards require full-time enrollment in fall and spring semesters, with no break in enrollment, and cannot be used in summer sessions. A cumulative GPA of 3.5 is required for renewal. Grades for renewal are only checked at the end of spring semester each year. Awards are limited to four years of enrollment. A student may receive either a Chancellor=s Scholarship, or a Chancellor=s Merit Award but not both.

Chancellor=s Merit Award

Criteria: The Chancellor=s Merit Award is intended to increase diversity in the IPFW student body, and to promote the enrollment of students with special talents. Up to 100 awards will be made to students who: (a) graduated from a high school outside of Indiana, have a high school rank in the top 25%, earn an SAT score of at least 1100 (an ACT score of at least 24), or a TOEFL score of at least 550, or (b) transfer from a college outside Indiana with at least 24 credits and a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0, or (c) have earned semifinalist or finalist status in the National Merit Scholarship competition. Transfer students with fewer credits completed will be evaluated on their high school record and test scores. Students must also be recommended by an IPFW administrator based on demonstration of a special academic or athletic talent. Awards require full-time enrollment in fall and spring semesters, with no break in enrollment, and cannot be used in summer sessions. A cumulative GPA of 3.0 is required for renewal. Grades for renewal are only checked at the end of spring semester each year. Awards are limited to four years of enrollment. A student may receive either a Chancellor=s Scholarship, or a Chancellor=s Merit Award but not both.

Arthur L. Lucas and Cora Lucas Chestnut Scholarship

Criteria: Students must be Allen County, Ind., residents who demonstrate financial need. Students must be admitted as a major in elementary education. No scholarship will exceed the amount charged by IPFW for annual tuition. It is the donor's wish that scholarships be awarded to those students who shall express a willingness and intention to restore to the fund the amounts received by them, and the donor intends that recipients will have a moral, but not legal, obligation to do so.

Child of Veteran & Public Safety Officer (CVO) Supplemental Grant

Criteria: Student must be a legal resident of the State of Indiana and must be admitted/enrolled in a degree program. The student's mother or father must have: (1) served in the Armed Forces of the United States from Apr. 6, 1917-July 2, 1912; or Sept. 16, 1940-Dec. 31, 1946; or June 25, 1950-Jan. 31, 1955, or Aug. 5, 1964-May 7, 1975; and (2) sustained a service-connected death or disability as documented by Veterans Administration records, or received a Purple Heart Award, and (3) was discharged under honorable conditions. This supplemental grant may be used for a maximum of 124 credit hours.

Students who are the child or spouse of a deceased police officer or firefighter must provide their notice of eligibility (issued by the State of Indiana) to Financial Aid Services. The following conditions apply to all students using the CVO remission: (a) it is not limited by age of applicant except that awards to public safety officer families are limited to students less than 23 years old, (b) it can be used for undergraduate or graduate study, (c) IPFW is not required to remit fees for academic terms completed prior to the application for the benefit and IPFW will not do so. File an Application for Remission of Fees for a Child of Disabled Veteran form with the State of Indiana Veteran's Affairs Office if this is the initial request to use the grant. This form is available in Financial Aid Services. Once the student completes the form and mails it to the state VA office, the form will be returned to the student. This form must then be given to Financial Aid Services by the student. In addition to the certification document from the Indiana Veteran's Affairs Office, all students using the remission must file a 2002-03 CDV application (available after Jan. 1, 2002) to use the remission for Fall 2002 and/or Spring 2003. To use the Remission for Summer 2002, the student must complete a 2002 IPFW Summer Application.

Olive B. Cole Foundation Assistance Program

Criteria: Student must be a Noble County, Ind., resident. Student must be attending or intending to attend IPFW on a part time basis. Students who have already attended must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0. Student must have demonstrated financial need. Students may obtain funding for a maximum of eight (8) semesters through this program.

Dr. Beaumont S. Cornell Scholarship

Criteria: Student must be a graduate of an Adams, Allen or Huntington County, Ind., high school and plan to become a medical doctor. First-time students (coming directly to IPFW from high school), must either (a) rank in the top 25 percent of their high school class and have SAT scores of at least 1250, or ACT composite of 28 or greater; or (b) rank in the top 10 percent of their high school class and have SAT scores of at least 1100, or ACT composite of 24 or greater. This scholarship is renewable, but a student must submit an application to be considered each year. An IPFW student must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.2 to be eligible for this scholarship. All Cornell Scholarship recipients must enroll full time.

Engineering, Technology, and Computer Science Scholarships for Excellence

Criteria: Scholarships sponsored by area companies and awarded each spring by the School of Engineering, Technology, and Computer Science to students admitted to a major in engineering, engineering technology and computer science.

Fort Wayne Press Club Scholarship

Criteria: Student must be a continuing IPFW student or a high school senior graduating from an accredited public, private, or parochial high school with an active journalism or publications program in northeastern Indiana counties. The student must have been recommended by a journalism faculty member or have been nominated by a high school publications teacher, demonstrated an interest in pursuing journalism as a career, and must have been admitted to IPFW. Awards are based on merit, including academic grades, extracurricular activities and demonstrated financial need.

Criteria: Student must be a freshman admitted as a major in education. Student must be an Allen County, IN resident, and have demonstrated financial need.

Friends of IPFW Scholarship

Criteria: Students must be a new high school graduate who ranks in the top 30 percent of their high school class and have SAT scores of at least 1100, or an ACT composite of 24 or greater. No application form is required for incoming students for this scholarship. Students who are admitted to IPFW by Mar. 31, 2002 will be considered. Two additional scholarships will be awarded to continuing IPFW students who have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.2 and have financial need. Continuing IPFW students must apply for consideration.

Criteria: Any IPFW freshman with a superior academic record is eligible to apply. Students must have demonstrated financial need. Students with a disability will be given first consideration for this scholarship. Incoming freshman are nominated by their high school guidance counselor. Students who receive this scholarship and who have maintained a 3.0 or higher cumulative GPA and continue to demonstrate financial need will have their scholarship renewed before any new scholarships are awarded.

Achievement is determined by reviewing high school rank and total SAT scores. An application and essay are required. A 2002-03 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) must be on file. Application deadline is Mar. 1, 2002.

Cumulative GPA and essay for current IPFW students or high school rank, SAT scores and essay for incoming freshmen will determine selection. A 2002-03 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) must be filed by Mar. 1, 2002. Scholarship application deadline is Mar. 1, 2002.

IPFW Alumni Scholarship (part-time students)

Criteria: Student must be an IPFW alumnus or a son, step-son, daughter, step-daughter, or spouse of an IPFW alumnus/na. Student must be a **part-time** IPFW student pursuing an undergraduate or graduate degree at the IPFW campus. Cumulative GPA and essay for current IPFW students or high school rank, SAT scores and essay for incoming freshman will determine selection. A 2002-03 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) must be filed by Mar. 1, 2002. Scholarship application deadline is Mar. 1, 2002.

IPFW Anniversary Scholarship

Criteria: Student must demonstrate superior academic achievement and leadership or service within their school or community. Students must be new high school graduates. Students are nominated by their high school guidance counselor. There is no application.

Mathematical Sciences Alumni Scholarship

Criteria: Student must intend to and actually enroll full time at IPFW as a freshman majoring in mathematics and be admitted to IPFW by early April. Candidates must submit a letter of application, including the student's name, address, social security number, telephone number, and the name of the high school the student attended. The student should also submit a high school transcript which reflects grades received through the end of the seventh semester (middle of the senior year). In addition, two letters of recommendation from teachers who have had the student in class, including at least one mathematics teacher, must be filed with the IPFW mathematical sciences department. IPFW must also receive a copy of the student's SAT or ACT scores. The student must place into MA 163 (Calculus) on the IPFW mathematics placement test, or the mathematics placement test that Purdue University administers at the student's high school.

Paul E. Shaffer Scholarship

Criteria: Student must be a graduate of Parkway High School, located in Rockford, Ohio. Student must be regularly admitted to IPFW in business, science, mathematics, engineering, or education. Recipients must maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 and be making reasonable academic progress toward a degree after their first year to continue to receive the scholarship. The scholarship is awarded to a single individual each year. The recipient must be continuously enrolled in consecutive semesters, excluding summer sessions. Recipients must take a minimum of 15 credit hours per semester and their course load should enable them to graduate in four years. A recipient may miss a semester in the event of an emergency if the recipient obtains a waiver. Waivers will be granted by the Vice Chancellor for Student Affairs. A committee from Parkway High School, consisting of the Superintendent, Principal, and Guidance

Counselor shall determine the recipient for this award.

SSACI Minority Teacher Scholarship

Criteria: Student must be a minority student (defined as black or Hispanic) seeking teaching certification. Student must be an Indiana resident, and be enrolled full time. Student must be pursuing or intend to pursue a course of study that would enable the student upon graduation to teach in an accredited elementary or secondary school in Indiana. Continuing IPFW students who apply for this scholarship must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5. Preference will be given to students enrolling in college for the first time.

Robert E. Wise Beginning Arts and Sciences Student Scholarship

Criteria: Half of in-state tuition and fees awarded to selected incoming new high school graduates who are admitted by March 1 to a degree program in the School of Arts and Sciences and who rank in the top 20 percent of their high school class and have SAT scores of 1100 or greater (or ACT of 24 or greater). Recipients must enroll in at least 12 hours each semester. This award is not available for summer sessions and is not renewable. Recipients of Chancellor=s Scholarships are not eligible for consideration. No application required.

Administrative and Professional Staff Dependent Scholarship

Criteria: Student must be eligible for the fee remission under the Purdue University guidelines. Student must apply by sending a memorandum to Financial Aid Services which includes the name of the sponsoring administrator (the student's parent, step-parent, or guardian), the administrator's campus telephone number, the name of the student, and if applicable the cumulative number of credit hours already completed. The memo must be received by Financial Aid Services by Aug. 1, 2002 (for Fall award, and/or academic year award), or by Dec. 1, 2002 (for a Spring 2003 only award). The student must maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 after the first semester of attendance and must not be an employee of IPFW who receives staff benefits. The student must reapply each year for this scholarship. Due to these deadlines which ASC has established, late applications will no longer be considered.
